



HOW TO WEAR YOUR JUNIOR GRAMMAR UNIFORM

General

All uniform items should be clean, labelled, ironed, in good repair and fit correctly.

Students in Prep are required to wear the Junior Grammar Prep uniform Monday to Friday, including their bucket hats.

Students in Years 1 to 6 must wear full formal uniform to school every Monday to Thursday, including their formal hats and their sports uniform including their bucket hats every Friday.

Full uniform, including hat, is to be worn when wearing the uniform in public, before school and after school e.g. at shopping centres (no joggers, thongs, hair down, etc.). Students must carry the Junior Grammar bags, including sports bag. No other type of bag is permitted.

Prep students are required to wear predominantly white track shoes with non-marking soles at all times.

All students in Years 3 to 6 are required to wear black leather, lace-up, traditional-style shoes. Students in Years 1 and Year 2 may have Velcro fastenings instead of laces. Loafers and Mary-Jane styles are not permitted. Shoes must be polished at all times. On Fridays, for all PE lessons/events, predominantly white track shoes with non-marking soles are to be worn.

Collars



All collars are to be worn 'out' when wearing pullovers.

The School Hat



The School Hat must be worn to and from School each day when students are attending excursions or school activities, unless directed otherwise.

It should be worn at all times when wearing the uniform in public.

Hair should be styled so the hat sits properly on the student's head.

Socks and Tights



White Socks - folded down.

Grey Socks - Pulled up under the knees, using Sock Garters to hold them up.

Navy Tights - Worn in winter by all girls.

Shoes



Students in Years 3 to 6 are required to wear black leather, lace-up, traditional-style school shoes. Students in Years 1 and 2 may have Velcro fastenings instead of laces. Shoes should be polished regularly.

On Fridays, for all PE lessons/events, predominantly white track shoes with non-marking soles are to be worn.

Jewellery and Make-up



The only jewellery allowed is a single pair of plain, small gold or silver studs or sleepers (girls only) and a plain watch. Brightly coloured watches are not permitted to be worn.

A religious necklace may be worn, but must be under the uniform and out of sight.

No make-up is to be worn (including foundation, eyeliner, mascara), with the exception of clear lip balm. Coloured nail polish is not permitted at school. Students will be asked to remove it.

Hair



Girls who have hair touching the collar must have it neatly tied back with navy ribbon. Long fringes should be pinned back.

Boys should have a school boys' haircut style, their hair should not be cut shorter than Blade 3 length and no longer than collar length.

Haircuts such as undercuts are not allowed.

Badges



The School Badge is worn on the lower part of the left collar (over the heart).

House Badges are pinned on the lower part of the right collar.

Student-of-the-Week badge is worn above the House badge on the right collar.
